SUMMARY

Requires Department of Education and Higher Education Coordinating Commission to establish career and technical education pathways to permit students to easily progress from secondary school to public post-secondary institutions of education.

Requires department and commission to present information on pathways to Legislative Assembly.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

2 Relating to career and technical education; and declaring an emergency.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Department of Education and the Higher Edu-5 cation Coordinating Commission shall by rule establish career and 6 technical education pathways that, to the maximum extent practica-7 ble, permit students to easily progress from secondary school to public 8 post-secondary institutions of education.

9 (2) As used in this section, "secondary school" means grades 9 10 through 12.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> The Department of Education and the Higher Education Coordinating Commission shall make a presentation during the 2018 regular session of the Legislative Assembly to the legislative committees responsible for education and higher education that:

5 SECTION 3. Section 2 of this 2017 Act is repealed on July 2, 2018.

6 SECTION 4. This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate pres-

ervation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect on its passage.
