

Hubs by Location




Common Goals

Community Housing

- Lane Early Learning Alliance and Cornerstone Community Housing collaborated to fund a Family Resource Navigator through a Meyer Memorial Trust grant.
- The Family Resource Navigator works directing with families living in affordable housing and aligns systems between affordable housing, social services, and Lane Early Learning Alliance.
- This collaboration allowed for expanded capacity to coordinate bringing local resources to affordable housing sites, breaking down barriers to access
- Visits from a Family Resource Navigator provides families with positive parenting support, family goal setting, and resource referrals leading to healthy, stable and attached families

Ages and Stages Questionnaire (ASQ) Developmental Screen

- Quality metric for CCOs and Early Learning Hubs
- Identifies developmental delays in young children.
- Grant-funded provider training in April 2016 in Newport
- Follow-up coaching/technical assistance from ORPRN

One clinic's results:

4 Months Prior	4 Months After
to Training	Training
ASQs Completed	ASQs Completed
YTD – 23	YTD – 209
Referrals to EI/ECSE* – 7	Referrals to EI/ECSE – 22

*EI/ECSE – Early Intervention/Early Childhood Special Education



- Kindergarten Partnership & Innovation Components
 - Pre-K through early elementary integrated professional learning
 - Community engagement & parent education
- 31 catchment areas, across region, in 9 school districts
- Plans developed locally with parent education as a key parent engagement KPI activity:
 - Evidence based, curriculum (eg. Nurturing Parenting, Abriendo Puertas)
 - READY! for Kindergarten
- Parent education is a way to connect with parents before they are in school
- Parent education as a way to build partnership with the community
