SUMMARY

Directs Department of Education to develop method for analyzing student progress toward high school graduation that takes account of change in degree of credit deficiency among credit-deficient students and change in dropout rate among credit-deficient students.

Requires school district and school performance reports to include information on progress toward graduation.

- 4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- 5 SECTION 1. (1) The Department of Education shall, by rule, develop
- 6 a method for analyzing the progress toward high school graduation for
- 7 any student population for which the department calculates a gradu-
- 8 ation rate.

- (2) The method of analysis must take into account:
- 10 (a) The percentage of students who are credit-deficient and the de-
- 11 gree of credit deficiency after each academic year;
- 12 (b) The change, year over year, in degree of credit deficiency among
- 13 credit-deficient students;
- 14 (c) The dropout rate among credit-deficient students; and
- 15 (d) The change, year over year, in the dropout rate among credit-
- 16 deficient students.
- 17 (3) The method of analysis may take into account any other factors
- 18 the department deems relevant.

- 1 (4) As used in this section, "credit-deficient" means having accu-
- 2 mulated, at a given point in time, less than the number of credits
- 3 necessary at that point in time to graduate from high school within
- 4 four years after enrolling.
- 5 **SECTION 2.** ORS 329.105 is amended to read:
- 6 329.105. (1) The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall collect data
- 7 and produce annual school district and school performance reports to provide
- 8 information to parents and to improve schools.
- 9 (2) The superintendent shall include in the school district and school
- 10 performance reports data for the following areas, for each school or district,
- 11 that are available to the Department of Education from the most recent
- 12 school year:
- 13 (a) Data required by the federal No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (P.L.
- 14 107-110, 115 Stat. 1425);
- 15 (b) Information about how to access the website that is maintained by the
- 16 State Department of Geology and Mineral Industries as provided by ORS
- 17 516.030 (6)(b);
- 18 (c) Information related to the number of children served in the district
- 19 and the number of children who are susceptible to restrictable disease, as
- 20 reported under ORS 433.269 (2)(a); [and]
- 21 (d) Any other data identified by the Department of Education as required
- 22 by federal law to be in the reports[.]; and
- 23 (e) An analysis of students' progress toward graduation in accord-
- 24 ance with the method developed under section 1 of this 2017 Act.
- 25 (3) In addition to the data required by subsection (2) of this section, the
- 26 superintendent may include other data on the school district and school
- 27 performance reports.
- 28 (4) The department shall work with stakeholders to:
- 29 (a) Design and implement an accountability system of progressive inter-
- 30 ventions for schools and school districts that do not demonstrate improve-
