

Mathematics




National Statistics

- 40% of children enter kindergarten with skills typical of 3 and 4 year olds.
- Those children will have to make two year's growth for three consecutive years to meet standard by the end of 3rd grade.
- The strongest indicator of academic performance at age 15 is school readiness in kindergarten.
- Early school success nearly guarantees later school success.
- No matter the intensity and duration of remediation efforts, only 15% of students who require remediation after 3rd grade ever catch up.
- Districts spend, on average, \$76,000 more per student, over the course of their schooling, on remediation for students who enter kindergarten with an achievement gap.
- The achievement gap that exists on the first day of kindergarten is most often the same achievement gap that exists in 11th grade.

McMinnville School District has implemented the following research-based strategies proven to prevent achievement gaps from developing and becoming entrenched:

- Ready for Kindergarten Child development instruction, coaching, and resources for parents of underserved children, ages birth to five
- Half-day preschool for four-year-olds (targeting underserved children)
- Kindergarten Transition Camp
- Wellness to Learn (medical, dental, mental healthcare)
- Full-day kindergarten
- Targeted interventions in K-3rd grade based on just-in-time data
- Extended day/year teaching and learning
- Community- and industry-based STEM/STEAM teaching and learning




