



## **United for Justice**

Oregon's Justice Reinvestment strategy is on track to reduce the growth of Oregon's prison population and save state taxpayers \$250 million in construction and operating costs by the end of this biennium. So far, it has averted \$52 million in prison operating costs and \$140 million in construction costs.

The Justice Reinvestment Act's success will depend on our continued commitment to a new way of addressing public safety through sufficient and dedicated resources that build an infrastructure of cost-effective programs that prevent crime before it occurs and keeps those convicted of crime from landing back in prison.

People who commit a crime should be held accountable for their actions. And once they have, we need to help them move forward and make a positive contribution to society. Justice reinvestment achieves what matters most: improving the system so that offenders are less likely to commit another crime.
