Measure Description:

Establishes medical assistance eligibility for individuals under age 26 who have aged out of foster care in Oregon or another state.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Oregon Health Authority (OHA), Department of Human Services (DHS)

Analysis:

This fiscal impact statement is for the purpose of transmitting the measure from the House Committee Health Care to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means.

House Bill 2451 establishes medical assistance eligibility for individuals under 26 years old who have aged out of foster care, and directs the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) to seek federal approval to and federal financial participation in covering the costs of providing medical assistance to these individuals.

This bill is anticipated to have a fiscal impact to the Oregon Health Authority and the Department of Human Services. The amount of this impact is still being determined. A more complete fiscal analysis on the bill will be prepared as the measure is considered in the Joint Committee on Ways and Means.

Further Analysis Required
