House Bill 2842

Sponsored by Representative NEARMAN

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires professional licensing boards to consider homeschool diploma to be equivalent to high school diploma for purposes of licensure, certification or other authorization needed to provide occupational or professional service.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to high school diploma requirements for professional licensure; and declaring an emer-3 gency.

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) As used in this section:

6 (a) "High school diploma" means a diploma issued upon the completion of grade 12 to an 7 individual by a school district, a public charter school or a community college.

8 (b) "Homeschool diploma" means a diploma issued upon the completion of grade 12 to an

9 individual who was educated in the individual's home by the parent or legal guardian of the
10 individual.

11 (c) "Occupational or professional service" means a service that may be provided in this 12 state only by individuals who possesses a license, a certificate or another form of authori-13 zation to perform the service.

14 (d) "Professional licensing board" means a state agency or board that:

15 (A) Has regulatory oversight over an occupational or professional service; and

16 (B) Issues licenses, certificates or other forms of authorization to individuals to author-

17 ize the individuals to provide an occupational or professional service.

(2) For the purpose of any minimum education requirements prescribed by a professional
licensing board for a license, certificate or other form of authorization required to provide
an occupational or professional service, a homeschool diploma shall be considered equivalent
to a high school diploma.

22 <u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 1 of this 2017 Act applies to applications for licensure, certification 23 or other authorization received by a professional licensing board on or after the operative 24 date specified in section 3 of this 2017 Act.

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SECTION 3. (1) Section 1 of this 2017 Act becomes operative on January 1, 2018.

26 (2) A professional licensing board may take any action before the operative date specified

27 in subsection (1) of this section that is necessary to enable the board to exercise, on or after

28 the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section, all of the duties, functions and

29 powers conferred on the board by section 1 of this 2017 Act.

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SECTION 4. This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public

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1 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect
