House Bill 3027

Sponsored by Representative BARNHART (at the request of Dr. Matt Freedman)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Creates crime of unlawful cetacean captivity. Punishes by maximum of one year's imprisonment, \$6,250 fine, or both.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to cetacean captivity; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 161.005.
 - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - SECTION 1. (1) A person commits the crime of unlawful cetacean captivity if the person knowingly:
 - (a) Holds a cetacean in captivity for performance or entertainment purposes;
 - (b) Breeds a cetacean in captivity;
 - (c) Imports, exports or collects semen, gametes or embryos of a cetacean for the purpose of artificial insemination; or
 - (d) Holds a cetacean in captivity in an enclosure other than a sea pen.
 - (2) Unlawful cetacean captivity is a Class A misdemeanor.

- (a) "Cetacean" means the members of the order Cetacea commonly known as whales, dolphins and porpoises.
 - (b) "Performance or entertainment purposes" means any routinely scheduled public exhibition characterized by cetacean choreography, public training of cetaceans for choreography or unprotected contact between humans and cetaceans and that may be accompanied by music, other sound effects or visual effects.
 - (c) "Sea pen" means an in-water enclosure anchored to the sea floor and attached to the shore or coastline, where up to seventy-five percent of the perimeter of the sea pen may consist of shore or coastline.
 - (d) "Unprotected contact" means physical contact between a human and a cetacean in the absence of a protective barrier or distance between the human and the cetacean.
