## House Bill 3248

Sponsored by Representatives CLEM, WITT; Representatives BARKER, BOONE (at the request of Carol Jones)

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Renames crime of interfering with an assistance, a search and rescue or a therapy animal to interfering with an assistance, a search and rescue or a therapy animal in the second degree. Expands crime and increases penalties to maximum of five years' imprisonment, \$125,000 fine, or both, if person has certain previous convictions at time of offense.

Creates crime of interfering with an assistance, a search and rescue or a therapy animal in the

Creates crime of interfering with an assistance, a search and rescue or a therapy animal in the first degree. Punishes by maximum of five years' imprisonment, \$125,000 fine, or both. Increases penalties to maximum of 10 years' imprisonment, \$250,000 fine, or both, if person has certain previous convictions at time of offense. Adds crime to list of offenses for which instrumentalities of crime may be criminally forfeited.

Specifies costs and expenses included in economic damages for purposes of restitution for conviction of interfering with an assistance, a search and rescue or a therapy animal.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to interfering with trained animals; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 30.822, 131.602 and 167.352.
- 4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- 5 <u>SECTION 1.</u> Sections 3 to 6 of this 2017 Act shall be known and may be cited as "Kyoto's Law."
- 7 <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) Sections 3 to 6 of this 2017 Act are added to and made a part of ORS 8 167.310 to 167.390.
  - (2) ORS 167.352 is added to and made a part of sections 3 to 6 of this 2017 Act.
- SECTION 3. As used in sections 3 to 6 of this 2017 Act:
- 11 (1) "Assistance animal" has the meaning given that term in ORS 659A.143.
- 12 (2) "Maliciously" has the meaning given that term in ORS 167.322.
- 13 (3) "Physical injury" has the meaning given that term in ORS 167.310.
- 14 (4) "Search and rescue animal" means an animal that has been professionally trained for, 15 and is actively used for, search and rescue purposes.
  - (5) "Serious physical injury" has the meaning given that term in ORS 167.310.
  - (6) "Therapy animal" means an animal other than an assistance animal that has been professionally trained for, and is actively used for, therapy purposes.
    - (7) "Torture" has the meaning given that term in ORS 167.322.
- 20 **SECTION 4.** ORS 167.352 is amended to read:
- 21 167.352. (1) A person commits the crime of interfering with an assistance, a search and rescue 22 or a therapy animal **in the second degree** if the person intentionally, [or] knowingly **or** 23 **recklessly**:
- 24 (a) [*Injures or*] Attempts to injure an animal the person knows or reasonably should know is an assistance animal, a search and rescue animal or a therapy animal;
  - (b) Interferes with, or allows an animal in the person's care or control to interfere with,

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- an assistance animal while the assistance animal is being used to provide assistance to a person with a disability; [or]
- (c) Interferes with, or allows an animal in the person's care or control to interfere with, a search and rescue animal or a therapy animal while the animal is being used for search and rescue or therapy purposes[.]; or
- (d) Allows an animal in the person's care or control to cause physical injury to an animal the person knows or reasonably should know is an assistance, a search and rescue or a therapy animal.
- [(2) As used in this section, "assistance animal" has the meaning given that term in ORS 659A.143.]
  - [(3) As used in this section and ORS 30.822:]

- [(a) "Search and rescue animal" means that the animal has been professionally trained for, and is actively used for, search and rescue purposes.]
- [(b) "Therapy animal" means an animal other than an assistance animal that has been professionally trained for, and is actively used for, therapy purposes.]
- [(4)] (2)(a) Except as provided in paragraph (b) of this subsection, interfering with an assistance, a search and rescue or a therapy animal is a Class A misdemeanor.
- (b) Interfering with an assistance, a search and rescue or a therapy animal in the second degree is a Class C felony if the person has a prior conviction under this section or section 5 of this 2017 Act at the time of the offense.
- SECTION 5. (1) A person commits the crime of interfering with an assistance, a search and rescue or a therapy animal in the first degree if the person:
  - (a) Maliciously kills an assistance, a search and rescue or a therapy animal;
- (b) Intentionally or knowingly tortures an assistance, a search and rescue or a therapy animal;
- (c) Intentionally, knowingly or recklessly causes physical injury to an animal the person knows or reasonably should know is an assistance, a search and rescue or a therapy animal; or
- (d) Recklessly allows an animal in the person's care or control to cause serious physical injury to or kill an animal the person knows or reasonably should know is an assistance, a search and rescue or a therapy animal.
- (2)(a) Except as provided in paragraph (b) of this subsection, interfering with an assistance, a search and rescue or a therapy animal in the first degree is a Class C felony.
- (b) Interfering with an assistance, a search and rescue or a therapy animal in the first degree is a Class B felony if the person has a prior conviction under this section or ORS 167.352 at the time of the offense.
- SECTION 6. For the purposes of determining restitution under ORS 137.101 to 137.109 for a violation of ORS 167.352 or section 5 of this 2017 Act:
- (1) If the crime involving the animal results in the death of the animal or if injuries sustained prevent the animal from returning to service as an assistance animal, the economic damages include, but are not limited to, the replacement value of an equally trained animal, without any differentiation for the age or the experience of the animal. In addition, the owner may recover any other costs and expenses, including, but not limited to, costs of temporary replacement services, whether provided by another animal or a person, incurred as a result of the loss of or injury to the animal.

(2) If the crime involving the animal results in injuries from which the animal recovers and returns to service, economic damages include, but are not be limited to, the veterinary medical expenses, costs of temporary replacement services, whether provided by another animal or a person, and any other costs and expenses incurred by the owner as a result of the injury to the animal.

**SECTION 7.** ORS 30.822 is amended to read:

30.822. (1) In addition to and not in lieu of any other penalty provided by state law, the owner of a search and rescue animal or a therapy animal, as defined in [ORS 167.352] section 3 of this 2017 Act, may bring an action for economic and noneconomic damages against any person who steals or, without provocation, attacks the search and rescue animal or therapy animal. The owner may also bring an action for such damages against the owner of any animal that, without provocation, attacks a search and rescue animal or therapy animal. The action authorized by this subsection may be brought by the owner even if the search and rescue or therapy animal was in the custody or under the supervision of another person when the theft or attack occurred.

- (2) If the theft of or unprovoked attack on a search and rescue animal or therapy animal described in subsection (1) of this section results in the death of the animal or the animal is not returned or if injuries sustained in the theft or attack prevent the animal from returning to service as a search and rescue animal or therapy animal, the measure of economic damages shall include, but need not be limited to, the replacement value of an equally trained animal, without any differentiation for the age or the experience of the animal.
- (3) If the theft of or unprovoked attack on a search and rescue animal or therapy animal described in subsection (1) of this section results in injuries from which the animal recovers and returns to service, or if the animal is stolen and is recovered and returns to service, the measure of economic damages shall include, but need not be limited to, the costs of temporary replacement services, veterinary medical expenses and any other costs and expenses incurred by the owner as a result of the theft of or injury to the animal.
- (4) No cause of action arises under this section if the owner or the person having custody or supervision of the search and rescue animal or therapy animal was committing a criminal or civil trespass at the time of the attack on the animal.
- (5) The court may award reasonable attorney fees to the prevailing party in an action under this section.
