

# HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 5045

By JOINT COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

1 Delete lines 4 through 15 of the printed bill and insert:

2 **“SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts**  
3 **are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, as the maximum limits for payment**  
4 **of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and fed-**  
5 **eral funds received as reimbursement from the United States Department of Transportation,**  
6 **but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not described in this section, collected or re-**  
7 **ceived by the Department of Transportation, for the following purposes:**

- 8 (1) Maintenance and emergency
- 9 relief programs ..... \$ 701,966
- 10 (2) Preservation program..... \$ 2,807,865
- 11 (3) Bridge program..... \$ 8,189,605
- 12 (4) Operations program..... \$ 11,000,000
- 13 (5) Modernization program..... \$ 13,000,000
- 14 (6) Special programs..... \$ 12,018,390
- 15 (7) Local government program..... \$ 7,000,000
- 16 (8) Driver and motor vehicle
- 17 services ..... \$ 450,014
- 18 (9) Transportation program
- 19 development ..... \$ 479,690
- 20 (10) Public transit..... \$ 51,497,620
- 21 (11) Central services ..... \$ 3,744,785

22 **“SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of**  
23 **\$389,122 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, as the maximum limit for**  
24 **payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts**  
25 **and federal funds received as reimbursement from the United States Department of Trans-**  
26 **portation, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not described in this section, col-**  
27 **lected or received by the Department of Environmental Quality, for permitting and program**  
28 **implementation.**

29 **“SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on**  
30 **expenditures established by section 2 (1), chapter \_\_, Oregon Laws 2017 (Enrolled Senate**  
31 **Bill 5535), for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, as the maximum limit for payment of ex-**  
32 **penses for administration from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Re-**  
33 **ceipts and reimbursements from federal service agreements, but excluding lottery funds and**  
34 **federal funds not described in section 2, chapter \_\_, Oregon Laws 2017 (Enrolled Senate Bill**  
35 **5535), collected or received by the Department of Revenue, is increased by \$510,500 for im-**

1 plementation of chapter \_\_, Oregon Laws 2017 (Enrolled House Bill 2017).

2 **“SECTION 4.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
3 expenditures established by section 2 (4), chapter \_\_, Oregon Laws 2017 (Enrolled Senate  
4 Bill 5535), for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, as the maximum limit for payment of ex-  
5 penses for the business division from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscella-  
6 neous Receipts and reimbursements from federal service agreements, but excluding lottery  
7 funds and federal funds not described in section 2, chapter \_\_, Oregon Laws 2017 (Enrolled  
8 Senate Bill 5535), collected or received by the Department of Revenue, is increased by  
9 \$615,200 for implementation of chapter \_\_, Oregon Laws 2017 (Enrolled House Bill 2017).

10 **“SECTION 5.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of  
11 \$2,747,420 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, as the maximum limit for  
12 payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts  
13 and reimbursements from federal service agreements, but excluding lottery funds and federal  
14 funds not described in this section, collected or received by the Department of Revenue, for  
15 the core system replacement program and implementation of chapter \_\_, Oregon Laws 2017  
16 (Enrolled House Bill 2017).

17 **“SECTION 6.** This 2017 Act is first operative on the effective date of chapter \_\_, Oregon  
18 Laws 2017 (Enrolled House Bill 2017).

19 **“SECTION 7.** This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public  
20 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect  
21 July 1, 2017.”.

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
