

Senate Bill 138

Sponsored by Senator DEMBROW (at the request of Oregon Community College Association) (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires Department of Education and Higher Education Coordinating Commission to establish career and technical education pathways to permit students to easily progress from secondary school to public post-secondary institutions of education.

Requires department and commission to present information on pathways to Legislative Assembly.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

1
2 Relating to career and technical education; and declaring an emergency.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. (1) The Department of Education and the Higher Education Coordinating**
5 **Commission shall by rule establish career and technical education pathways that, to the**
6 **maximum extent practicable, permit students to easily progress from secondary school to**
7 **public post-secondary institutions of education.**

8 **(2) As used in this section, "secondary school" means grades 9 through 12.**

9 **SECTION 2. The Department of Education and the Higher Education Coordinating Com-**
10 **mission shall make a presentation during the 2018 regular session of the Legislative Assem-**
11 **bly to the legislative committees responsible for education and higher education that:**

12 **(1) Details the administrative rules enacted under section 1 of 2017 Act;**

13 **(2) Describes any additional administrative rules that the department or the commission**
14 **anticipate enacting under section 1 of this 2017 Act; and**

15 **(3) Describes any additional legislation that the department or the commission believes**
16 **is necessary in order to implement the policy set forth in section 1 of this 2017 Act.**

17 **SECTION 3. Section 2 of this 2017 Act is repealed on July 2, 2018.**

18 **SECTION 4. This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**
19 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect**
20 **on its passage.**
