Senate Bill 207

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SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Requires each public university and community college to provide credit to students who receive certain grades on advanced placement examinations.

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- 2 Relating to receiving credit for advanced placement performance.
 - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section:
 - (a) "Advanced placement program" means a nationwide program that offers college-level curricula and examinations to high school students, such as the advanced placement (AP) program.
 - (b) "Community college" has the meaning given that term in ORS 341.005.
 - (c) "Successful grade on the examination" means the grade received by a student who:
 - (A) Participated in the nationwide examination offered at the conclusion of an advanced placement program; and
 - (B) Received a grade on the nationwide examination indicating that the student is fully qualified to receive college credit for the program, such as a grade of three or higher on an advanced placement (AP) examination.
 - (2) Each public university listed in ORS 352.002 and each community college shall give credit for each instance in which a student enrolled at the public university or community college has:
 - (a) Participated in an advanced placement program; and
 - (b) Received a successful grade on the examination.
- 20 SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2017 Act first applies to the 2018-2019 academic year.

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
