Senate Bill 410

Sponsored by Senator FERRIOLI (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Allows local government to opt out of minimum wage increases in effect after July 1, 2016, with annual adjustment based on consumer price index. Applies to local government and employers under jurisdiction of local government.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

1 A BILL FOR AN ACT

- Relating to ability of local government to opt out of state minimum wage requirement; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2017 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 653.
 - SECTION 2. (1) Notwithstanding ORS 653.017 and 653.025, a local government as defined in ORS 190.710 may set the minimum wage rate for the local government and employers under the jurisdiction of the local government at the minimum wage rate in effect for the location on July 1, 2016, adjusted annually for inflation as provided in subsection (2) of this section.
 - (2) No later than April 30 of each year, the Commissioner of the Bureau of Labor and Industries shall calculate an adjustment of the wage rate set under subsection (1) of this section based upon the increase, if any, from March of the preceding year to March of the year in which the calculation is made in the U.S. City Average Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers for All Items as prepared by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the United States Department of Labor or its successor.
 - <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect on its passage.
