## A-Engrossed Senate Bill 434

Ordered by the Senate February 27 Including Senate Amendments dated February 27

Sponsored by Senator FERRIOLI (Presession filed.)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the

Creates Task Force on Wildfire Damage Financial Relief. Requires task force to develop recommendations regarding increasing maximum household income levels qualifying for financial assistance from Wildfire Damage Housing Relief Account.

Requires task force to report findings and recommendations to interim committee of Legislative Assembly no later than September 15, 2019. Sunsets task force December 31, 2019.

[Declares emergency, effective on passage.]
Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

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- Relating to financial assistance to households of lower income following a wildfire; and prescribing an effective date. 3
- Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
  - SECTION 1. (1) The Task Force on Wildfire Damage Financial Relief is established.
  - (2) The task force consists of nine members appointed as follows:
  - (a) The President of the Senate shall appoint one nonvoting member from among members of the Senate.
  - (b) The Senate Minority Leader shall appoint one voting member with expertise in postdisaster community recovery.
  - (c) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint one nonvoting member from among members of the House of Representatives.
  - (d) The House Minority Leader shall appoint one voting member with expertise in postdisaster community recovery.
  - (e) The Governor shall appoint five voting members, one with expertise in banking, one with expertise in residential construction and three who experienced loss from devastating wildfire on or after January 1, 2013, and on or before December 31, 2015. Of the three members who experienced loss, two shall be landowners and one shall be a nonowner tenant.
  - (3) The task force shall study the economic and other post-disaster needs of households suffering loss of housing from wildfire occurring in recent fire years, as defined by the task force, including but not limited to the Canyon Creek Complex fire in 2015. The task force shall develop recommendations based on the study regarding whether, and to what extent, the maximum household income level qualifying for financial assistance from the Wildfire Damage Housing Relief Account should be increased.
    - (4) The task force may take all lawful actions and exercise any lawful powers the task

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- force deems reasonable for facilitating its work, including but not limited to conducting public hearings.
- (5) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business.
- (6) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the voting members of the task force.
  - (7) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson.
- (8) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appointment to become immediately effective.
- (9) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson or of a majority of the voting members of the task force.
  - (10) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.
- (11) The task force shall submit a report in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and may include recommendations for legislation, to an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related to human services no later than September 15, 2019.
- (12) The Housing and Community Services Department shall provide staff support to the task force.
- (13) Members of the task force who are not members of the Legislative Assembly are not entitled to compensation or reimbursement for expenses and serve as volunteers on the task force.
- (14) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist the task force in the performance of the task force's duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish information and advice the members of the task force consider necessary to perform their duties.
  - SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2017 Act is repealed on December 31, 2019.
- SECTION 3. This 2017 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2017 regular session of the Seventy-ninth Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.
