Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

HB 4013 A

Provides that person employed on full-time basis in office of State Treasurer or Secretary of State may serve on State Board of Education.

HB 4044 A

Directs Chief Education Office to conduct study on recruitment, retention, mentoring and professional development of educators who serve students from student groups that may be at risk for experiencing achievement gap.

Public Hearing

HB 4113

Includes class size as mandatory subject of school district collective bargaining.

Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

HB 4141 A

Requires each public university to establish advisory body to advise university president on recommendations to governing board regarding tuition and mandatory enrollment fees.

HB 4150 A

Requires specified information to be shared with student, staff member or certain person following conclusion of investigation related to sexual harassment.

Work Session

HB 4036 A

Modifies description of types of interscholastic activities in which homeschooled students and students who attend public charter schools must be allowed to participate if students are in any grade from kindergarten through grade eight.
