Although our focus is on increasing housing supply and not on direct Sally Russell services, during the cold weather season, I receive daily calls from those searching for housing assistance. Many have already attempted to **CITY COUNCILORS** receive assistance from our partners and have been denied due to lack Justin Livingston of funding. These are seniors on fixed incomes, veterans, and families with small children. These are people who were forced to start again **Bill Moseley** during the recession, and those who hoped that a full time job would be **Bruce Abernethy** enough to pay rent. Nathan Boddie The housing crisis we see every day feels particularly acute in Central Oregon, where our vacancy rate hovers near 1%, and our home prices Barb Campbell have doubled since 2011. We know from our most recent Housing Needs Analysis that we lack 16,000 units. We also know that the CITY MANAGER shortage is unevenly concentrated in populations making less than 80%

Area Median Income—about \$51,000 per year for a family of four. We also know that at any given time, fewer than 2 homes are available for purchase in the City of Bend for the same income range. With the steady

influx of above-median-wage workers, our lower income populations must compete, and often lose, to those moving in from elsewhere.

Bend has employed a variety of innovative strategies to increase the supply of affordable housing. Alas, our local solutions cannot alleviate the growing need alone. We applaud the Committee for your leadership on this issue.

We thank the Committee for considering an increase to this important source of funding for the support of the housing continuum, and eagerly await the outcome.
