I am a homeowner in River Rim, Bend who lives close to our Park District's proposed footbridge over the Deschutes River.

I would respectfully ask that you vote NO on this bill. Barring that, please consider tabling this bill for now to give time for further discussion and input on ways to proceed with a footbridge in a way that has no impact on the environment. Our Parks District is interested in conducting just such a study.
