

Expand Access to Psychiatric Care for Rural Oregon – Support SB 1539

On behalf of the Oregon Rural Health Association, I would like to express our **support for SB 1539**.

SB 1539 would expand access to psychiatric expertise for primary care providers across the state as they address the mental health needs of their patients. <u>Though access to mental health care is an issue state wide, access in rural areas of the state is particularly limited.</u>

According to the Oregon Office of Rural Health's 2017 Areas of Unmet Health Care Need Report, "There are 1.9 mental health providers per 1,000 people in Oregon. <u>Twenty-four of 130 service areas (all rural) had no mental health providers. An</u> <u>additional 33 service areas (all rural) have 0.5 or fewer mental health providers per</u> <u>1,000 people.</u> The highest numbers per 1,000 are in the urban areas of Portland Downtown (15.9), Portland Inner South (7.8) and Eugene/University (7.1)."

<u>SB 1539 is a cost-effective way of expanding access in those places that need it most.</u>
