Chair Clem, Vice-Chairs McLain and Sprenger and members of the Committee:

I am a homeowner on Buck Canyon Road just south of Bend oregon. Bend Parks and Recreation has proposed a walking bridge across the Deschutes River in our neighborhood, connecting the communities of south Bend and Deschutes River Woods to U.S. Forest Service and federal lands on the west side.

The current measure House Bill 4029 calls for a ban on a bridge crossing the Deschutes River at the current designated location. There are claims that this would negatively affect wildlife habitat, but as this is already a developed area on both sides of the river, and walking bridges have already been put in Bend without negatively affecting the river. These claims seem untrue to me.
