Dear Chair Greenlick, Vice Chairs, and Members of the Committee,

We, Latino Network, are writing to express our strong support for HB 4133 - creating a Maternal Mortality and Morbidity Review Committee (MMRC) within the Oregon Health Authority to study and review maternal death and morbidity cases in Oregon. We believe this legislation is the right step toward understanding the intersectional reasons that lead to people dying from pregnancy-related complications, while also providing recommendations and protocols for policymakers, providers, and healthcare facilities on how to prevent future deaths and make pregnancies safer in Oregon.

Latino Network is a culturally specific service provider and advocacy organization that primarily serves the Latino community. Latino Network's mission is to positively transform the lives of Latino youth, families, and communities. Our work springs from the core belief in Latino community self-determination—that is, the ability of community members to participate meaningfully in the decisions that affect their lives and the lives of their families.
