ELD Funding Request

- Additional Office of Child Care Staffing
 - **\$1,740,912**
 - Total of 14 positions/7.72 FTE
 - 3 manager positions in OCC
 - 6 child care licensors
 - 5 limited duration positions to pilot joint investigations with DHS
- Lead testing for license-exempt providers serving families receiving child care subsidies (Regulated Subsidy Providers)
 - **\$239,796**
 - Includes administrative support through an existing contractor

Why urgent need

- □ Tragedies in child care
- New steps and procedures to strengthen oversight
- New rules requiring testing water for lead in child care facilities
- Impact of recently implemented new federal monitoring requirements on caseloads

ELD Funding Request: Licensing Staff

- G Additional Licensing Staff
 - **\$**749,337
- a 3 positions Compliance Specialist 3
 - Provide training to licensing staff; review findings of enforcement actions; lead case reviews; reduce licensing caseloads
- a 3 positions Compliance Specialist 2
 - Lower caseloads; expand capacity to increase unannounced visits

Licensing Caseloads

- □ Recommended caseload: 1 licensing specialist per 50 facilities
- □ Current Oregon caseload: 1 licensing specialist per 150 facilities
- Revised Oregon caseload with requested staffing: 1 licensing specialist per 138 facilities

ELD Funding Request

Requesting 3 positions (1.66 FTE)

- □ \$410,181
 - Licensing Director to oversee day-to-day operations
 - Regional Manager (Medford) to oversee day-to-day operations in the Medford field office
 - Additional Manager in the Central Office (Salem), to support operations of the central office team

Average current manager-to-staff ratio: 1:21

HB 3165 (2013) target: 1:11

Focused oversight of licensing system

Quality assurance

- Review of licensor actions
- Tracking timely visits and follow up
- Reviewing data and reports to identify patterns, and adjust management practices accordingly
- Successful implementation of new procedures and processes
- □ Greater consistency in the field
 - Documenting findings from inspections and complaint visits
 - Decision-making regarding citations, investigations, and follow up actions
- □ Enhanced, more frequent training for licensing staff

ELD Funding Request: Pilot of Tandem Investigations

Agency Request 5 LD Compliance Specialist 2 positions \$581,390

- Allow OCC to conduct joint investigations with DHS when allegations of abuse and neglect occur in licensed child care
 - Currently OCC & DHS conduct separate investigations
 - New highly trained OCC investigators would accompany DHS on investigations
 - Pilot in Portland Metro, Salem & Eugene

Current Investigative Authority/Roles

Department of Human Services

- Investigate allegations of abuse and neglect including in child care facilities
- Determine if abuse or neglect occurred, if child is in imminent danger, and work with partners on appropriate actions

Early Learning Division

- Investigate whether a child care facility is in violation of regulations
- Take administrative action to ensure safety of all children in the facility

Urgent Need for Joint Action

- Agencies conduct separate investigations OCC waits for CPS investigations
- OCC cannot take timely actions without first-hand evidence
- OCC lacks staff trained in this kind of investigative practice
- Need to increase understanding of type and timeliness of information that each agency shares during course of investigation

Commitment by ELD & DHS Leadership

- Conduct review of joint investigations pilot
 - Secretary of State audit of pilot
- Determine if additional policy or statutory changes are needed to support the success of this shared work
- □ Next steps:
 - Signed Intergovernmental Agreement
 - Work group formed to develop pilot and outcome metrics
 - New staff hired by April 1st, pending funding

Lead Testing

- Early Learning Council adopting rules on February 22nd requiring all licensed child care and regulated subsidy facilities to conduct lead testing of water and take steps to prevent children's exposure to lead
- Mitigation: child care facilities will be required to submit a corrective action plan for approval; ELD in collaboration with OHA will analyze test data to assess extent of problem and costs for full mitigation

Lead Testing

- \$237,796 to cover the cost of lead testing only for Regulated Subsidy Providers
 - Regulated Subsidy Providers are our least-resourced providers serving Oregon's most vulnerable children
 - Covers \$35 per test per fixture/estimated 2 fixtures for home
 - For Portland Metro area, some of the testing cost covered by Portland Water Bureau
 - Includes funding for administrative support to process the reimbursement of lead testing through an existing contractor
