ERDC OVERVIEW

ERDC is a subsidy program that helps low-income, working families pay for child care so parents can retain employment.

Families Served

8,200 families*
15,580 children

Eligibility

Income must be
below 185%
of the Federal
Poverty Level

Budget

- \$159.4 million

Average number of families served

- 8,378 cases can be sustained

ERDC CASELOAD

Families receiving ERDC services since the reservation list started.

November 2017	December 2017	January 2018
8,200	7,786	7,530

RESERVATION LIST

Implemented in 2017

Monitored on a monthly basis to determine availability into the program

January 12, 2018: first pull

- 337 invitations*

February 13, 2018: second pull

- 914 invitations*

*after duplicates are removed



TEEN PARENT CONTRACTS

22 contracts have been executed.

Potential to serve 240 children of teen parents.

SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER CONTRACTS

Contract with 10 Substance
Use Disorder facilities
across state

Estimate 600 children
served per year
