## **House Concurrent Resolution 205**

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Recognizes and honors Private First Class Brice M. Scott (1988-2011) for his service to his country.

<b>2</b>	Whereas Private First Class Brice M. Scott was born on September 17, 1988, in Eugene, Oregon;

4	Whereas Private First Class Scott attended North Eugene High School and was awarded a
5	General Educational Development certificate; and
6	Whereas Private First Class Scott enlisted in the United States Army in March 2010, joining a
7	long line of family members who had served in the military; and
8	Whereas Private First Class Scott was assigned to the 4th Squadron, 4th Cavalry Regiment, 1st
9	Heavy Brigade Combat Team, 1st Infantry Division, based at Fort Riley, Kansas; and
10	Whereas Private First Class Scott was a 19D Cavalry Scout and belt-fed machine gunner; and
11	Whereas Private First Class Scott deployed to Afghanistan in February 2011; and
12	Whereas Private First Class Scott and two other soldiers were working on a security checkpoint
13	in Kandahar Province, Afghanistan, when they were ambushed by eight insurgents; and
14	Whereas on July 31, 2011, Private First Class Scott succumbed to wounds sustained from enemy
15	small arms fire while trying to help one of his fellow soldiers; and
16	Whereas family members of Private First Class Scott said that he always tried to help others
17	and put their needs before his own; and
18	Whereas Private First Class Scott was honored with a military service in Florence, Oregon,
19	where a United States Coast Guard helicopter did a fly-by and flags lined the streets; and
20	Whereas Private First Class Scott was also honored in a service at Fort Riley, where his wife
21	and two young daughters were living; and
22	Whereas the Legislative Assembly wishes to honor the sacrifices of Private First Class Scott in
23	support of Operation Enduring Freedom; now, therefore,
24	Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:
25	That we, the members of the Seventy-ninth Legislative Assembly, recognize and honor Private
26	First Class Brice M. Scott for his service to his country.
