

House Concurrent Resolution 206

Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Pre-session filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Rules for Oregon State University)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Congratulates Oregon State University on its 150th anniversary.

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

2 Whereas the United States Congress adopted the Morrill Act, which President Abraham Lincoln
3 signed into law on July 2, 1862, allowing each state to establish a public higher education institution
4 that would be supported in part by a grant of federal lands; and

5 Whereas the State of Oregon between 1863 and 1868 took steps to identify public lands and
6 designate an appropriate higher education institution; and

7 Whereas on August 22, 1868, articles of incorporation were filed for Corvallis College and on
8 October 27, 1868, now known as Oregon State University Charter Day, the college was officially
9 chartered; and

10 Whereas upon the effective date of the charter, the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon
11 directed that Corvallis College be designated the state's agricultural college and provide teaching
12 in agriculture, engineering and military tactics; and

13 Whereas in 1870 the first graduating class included three students—two men and one
14 woman—and Corvallis College became the “people’s school” of Oregon; and

15 Whereas 150 years after being chartered, Oregon State University serves as Oregon’s statewide
16 university and provides access to high quality higher education for all Oregonians; and

17 Whereas the physical expansion of Corvallis College began in 1887 and in the fall of 1889 the
18 college moved to the present site of Oregon State University’s 530-acre campus in Corvallis; and

19 Whereas since completion of its first building, Oregon State University now operates from its
20 Corvallis campus, the OSU-Cascades campus in Bend, the Hatfield Marine Science Center in
21 Newport, forest research laboratories and 14 agricultural experiment stations; and

22 Whereas Oregon State University continues its original land grant mission through Oregon
23 State University Extension Service offices and programs in each of Oregon’s 36 counties; and

24 Whereas Corvallis College later became State Agricultural College and had several other name
25 changes before becoming Oregon State College in 1937 and, finally, Oregon State University in 1961;
26 and

27 Whereas Oregon State University is now Oregon’s largest university with more than 31,500 en-
28 rolled students, of whom each year approximately two-thirds are Oregon resident undergraduates;
29 and

30 Whereas Oregon State University enhances a healthy planet, healthy people and healthy econ-
31 omy through teaching, research and statewide outreach and public services of the Oregon State

1 University Extension Service and 4-H Youth Development Program; and

2 Whereas in fiscal year 2017, Oregon State University received \$441 million in annual funding
3 from state and federal governments, businesses and foundations for research on a wide range of
4 projects in natural resources, health, engineering and science across the state and around the world;
5 and

6 Whereas research at Oregon State University enables lifesaving health discoveries, environ-
7 mental enhancement, pioneering innovations that create jobs, discoveries that unlock the mysteries
8 of our oceans and learning that promotes safety and fosters knowledge to manage the impacts of
9 issues such as hunger, climate change and wildfires; and

10 Whereas faculty members at Oregon State University have educated generations of students,
11 made vital scientific discoveries, created renowned works of literature and art and been awarded
12 the Nobel Prize, the National Medal of Science, the MacArthur Fellowship and countless other
13 honors; and

14 Whereas Oregon State University is committed to inclusive excellence and more than 23 percent
15 of its enrollment is made up by students underrepresented in the United States, 11.5 percent by
16 international students, 23 percent by first-generation college students and three percent by veterans
17 of the Armed Forces of the United States; and

18 Whereas Oregon State University's student athletes have won many conference and national
19 championships, served as leaders and role models on campus and in the community and inspired
20 millions of fans who are proud members of Beaver Nation; and

21 Whereas graduates of Oregon State University have become leaders in Oregon and throughout
22 the nation and the world in business, government, academia, the military, science, medicine, the arts
23 and every other field of human endeavor; and

24 Whereas the Oregon State University Alma Mater Song, "Carry Me Back," composed in 1919
25 by W. Homer Maris, includes lyrics that still resonate with alumni nearly a century later: "Carry
26 me back to OSU, Back to her vine-clad halls; Thus fondly ever in my mem'ry, Alma Mater calls";
27 and

28 Whereas Oregon State University now serves Oregon, the nation and the world through the
29 teaching and research of 11 colleges—Agricultural Sciences, Business, Education, Engineering,
30 Forestry, Liberal Arts, Pharmacy, Public Health and Human Sciences, Science, Veterinary Medicine
31 and Earth, Ocean and Atmospheric Sciences—as well as the Honors College and Graduate School;
32 and

33 Whereas Oregon State University has one of the nation's top online learning programs and of-
34 fers more than 45 undergraduate and graduate degrees to students; and

35 Whereas Oregon State University is one of only two universities in the United States that have
36 been honored with land, sea, space and sun grant designations; and

37 Whereas Oregon State University's statewide annual economic impact totals more than \$2.2
38 billion; and

39 Whereas Oregon State University officially recognizes its 150th anniversary as Oregon's state-
40 wide university on October 27, 2018; now, therefore,

41 **Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:**

42 That we, the members of the Seventy-ninth Legislative Assembly, acknowledge the 150th anni-
43 versary of Oregon State University and congratulate Oregon State University, more than 170,000
44 OSU alumni and all Oregonians on this significant public milestone of service, leadership and con-
45 tributions to the State of Oregon. Go Beavs!
