(1) A student at a community college who is a member of the military, a member of 3 the commissioned corps of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration or a member of 4 $\mathbf{5}$ the Public Health Service of the United States Department of Health and Human Services detailed by proper authority for duty with the Army or Navy of the United States and who is ordered to 6 7 federal or state active duty for more than 30 consecutive days has the following rights: "(a) With regard to a course in which the student is enrolled and for which the student has paid 8 9 tuition and fees, the right to: 10 "(A) Withdraw from the course, subject to the provisions of subsection (2) of this section; 11 "(B) Receive a grade of incomplete and, upon release from active duty, complete the course in 12accordance with the community college's practice for completion of incomplete courses; or 13 "(C) Continue and complete the course for full credit, subject to the provisions of subsection (3) 14 of this section; 15(b) The right to a credit described in ORS 341.502 for all amounts paid for room, board, tuition 16 and fees; 17 "(c) If the student elects to withdraw from the community college, the right to be readmitted 18 and reenrolled at the community college within one year after release from active duty without a 19 requirement of redetermination of admission eligibility; and 20 "(d) The right to continuation of scholarships and grants awarded to the student that were 21funded by the community college or the Office of Student Access and Completion before the student 22was ordered to active duty. The Higher Education Coordinating Commission may adopt rules 23 for the administration of this paragraph. 24 "(2) If the student elects to withdraw from a course under subsection (1)(a)(A) of this section, the community college may not: 2526 "(a) Give the student academic credit for the course from which the student withdraws; 27"(b) Give the student a failing grade or a grade of incomplete or make any other negative an-28notation on the student's record; or 29 "(c) Alter the student's grade point average due to the student's withdrawal from the course. "(3) A student who elects to continue and complete a course for full credit under subsection 30 31 (1)(a)(C) of this section is subject to the following conditions: 32"(a) Course sessions the student misses due to active duty shall be counted as excused absences 33 and may not adversely impact the student's grade for the course or rank in the student's class. 34 (b) The student may not be automatically excused from completing course assignments due 35during the period the student serves on active duty.

"(a)(A) In accordance with a policy or practice of the community college for excused absences, the student may complete any missed course assignment, examination or other course work after the student has returned from active duty or medical treatment and has been provided a reasonable amount of time to complete the assignment or other course work or prepare for and take the examination; or

"SECTION 2. ORS 352.293 is amended to read:

38 "352.293. (1) A student at a public university listed in ORS 352.002 who is a member of the 39 military, a member of the commissioned corps of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Adminis-40 tration or a member of the Public Health Service of the United States Department of Health and 41 Human Services detailed by proper authority for duty with the Army or Navy of the United States 42 and who is ordered to federal or state active duty for more than 30 consecutive days has the fol-43 lowing rights:

44 "(a) With regard to a course in which the student is enrolled and for which the student has paid 45 tuition and fees, the right to: 1 "(A) Withdraw from the course, subject to the provisions of subsection (2) of this section;

2 "(B) Receive a grade of incomplete and, upon release from active duty, complete the course in 3 accordance with the practice of the public university for completion of incomplete courses; or

(1) A student at the Oregon Health and Science University who is a member of the military, a member of the commissioned corps of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration or a member of the Public Health Service of the United States Department of Health and Human Services detailed by proper authority for duty with the Army or Navy of the United States and who is ordered to federal or state active duty for more than 30 consecutive days has the following rights:

34 "[(4)] (5) The Oregon Health and Science University Board of Directors shall adopt rules for the 35 administration of this section.

36 "(6) Nothing in this section prevents the university from providing rights in addition to 37 those provided in this section to students who are ordered to federal or state active duty.

"[(5)] (7) As used in this section, 'member of the military' means a person who is a member of:

39 "(a) The Oregon National Guard or the National Guard of any other state or territory; or

42 "<u>SECTION 4.</u> The amendments to ORS 341.499, 352.293 and 353.200 by sections 1 to 3 of
43 this 2018 Act first apply to students who are ordered to active duty after the beginning of
44 the 2018-2019 academic year.
