PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 4030

1 On page 2 of the printed bill, delete lines 22 through 31 and insert:

"(12)(a) If a court imposes a fine as penalty for an offense under the wildlife laws that involves the unlawful taking or killing of wildlife listed under ORS 496.705 (2), the court may order that the defendant pay a portion of the fine separately to the clerk of the court as a compensatory fine. The clerk shall pay over to the State Fish and Wildlife Commission the amount paid by the defendant as a compensatory fine under this subsection.

"(b) Notwithstanding ORS 153.018, 161.625 or 161.635 or any specific fine 8 statute establishing a maximum fine for an offense that involves the unlaw-9 ful taking or killing of wildlife listed under ORS 496.705 (2), if the maximum 10 amount recoverable under ORS 496.705 (2) as damages for the unlawful tak-11 ing or killing is a greater amount, the court may impose a fine that is 12 greater than the applicable maximum fine specified for the offense under 13 ORS 153.018, 161.625 or 161.635 or the specific fine statute. If the court im-14 poses a fine under this subsection that is greater than the applicable maxi-15mum fine specified for an offense under ORS 153.018, 161.625 or 161.635 or a 16 specific fine statute, the court shall include the portion of the imposed fine 17 that is greater than the maximum fine specified for the offense in the amount 18 ordered to be paid as a compensatory fine. A compensatory fine under this 19 subsection may not exceed the maximum damages amount specified under 20ORS 496.705 (2) as damages for the unlawful taking or killing. 21

"(c) Notwithstanding ORS 496.705, the amount recoverable under ORS 496.705 (2) by the commission as damages for an unlawful taking or killing of wildlife shall be reduced by any compensatory fine that a court imposes under this subsection for the unlawful taking or killing.".
