Whereas Sergeant Fennerty was survived by his parents, Dr. M. Brian
and Maureen Fennerty, and siblings, Kelly, Colleen and Conor Fennerty; and
"Whereas Chief Warrant Officer 3 Jonathan Shelby Gibson was born on
February 15, 1981, in Fairbanks, Alaska; and

chief and completed two sea deployments, serving primarily in the Middle
East; and

"Whereas in 2008, Chief Warrant Officer 3 Gibson applied to flight school, which he attended from 2009 to 2011 in Pensacola, Florida; and

"Whereas in 2011, Chief Warrant Officer 3 Gibson returned to San Diego as a pilot and was assigned to Helicopter Sea Combat Squadron SIX, nicknamed the 'Screamin' Indians'; and

"Whereas in February 2013, Chief Warrant Officer 3 Gibson and his
 squadron were deployed to the Middle East in support of Operation Enduring
 Freedom; and

"Whereas Chief Warrant Officer 3 Gibson was killed on September 22,
2013, when his helicopter crashed while trying to land aboard the USS *William P. Lawrence* in heavy seas; and
