PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 4063

On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after the first semicolon delete the 1 rest of the line and delete line 3 and insert "and declaring an emergency.". 2 Delete lines 5 through 29 and delete pages 2 and 3 and insert: 3 "SECTION 1. The Department of Transportation is the lead agency 4 responsible for coordination of autonomous vehicle programs and pol-5 icies.

"SECTION 2. (1) The Task Force on Autonomous Vehicles is estab-7 lished. 8

"(2) The task force consists of 19 members appointed as follows: 9

"(a) The President of the Senate shall appoint two members from 10 among members of the Senate who are not members of the same 11 12party.

"(b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint two 13 members from among members of the House of Representatives who 14 are not members of the same party. 15

"(c) The Director of Transportation shall appoint 15 members as 16 follows: 17

"(A) Six members representing state agencies that will be affected 18 by the deployment of autonomous vehicles. 19

"(B) Nine members from among the following: 20

"(i) The automotive industry; 21

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- 1 "(ii) The cybersecurity industry;
- 2 "(iii) Law enforcement;
- 3 "(iv) Transportation network companies;
- 4 "(v) The autonomous vehicle technology industry;
- 5 "(vi) The automotive insurance industry;
- 6 "(vii) Trial lawyers; and
- 7 "(viii) Representatives of unions.

"(3)(a) The task force shall develop recommendations for legislation
to be introduced during the next odd-numbered year regular session
of the Legislative Assembly regarding the deployment of autonomous
vehicles on highways.

- "(b) The proposed legislation under this section shall be consistent
 with federal law and guidelines and shall address the following issues:
- 14 "(A) Licensing and registration;
- 15 "(B) Law enforcement and accident reporting;
- 16 "(C) Cybersecurity; and
- 17 "(D) Insurance and liability.

"(4) The task force may study and consider the potential long-term
 effects of autonomous vehicle deployment to be addressed in future
 legislation, including the following:

- 21 **"(a) Land use;**
- 22 "(b) Road and infrastructure design;
- 23 "(c) Public transit;
- 24 "(d) Workforce changes; or
- ²⁵ "(e) State responsibilities relating to cybersecurity and privacy.
- 26 "(5) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes
- 27 a quorum for the transaction of business.
- "(6) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a
 majority of the voting members of the task force.
- 30 "(7) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as

1 chairperson.

"(8) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority
 shall make an appointment to become immediately effective.

"(9) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the
call of the chairperson or of a majority of the voting members of the
task force.

7 "(10) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation
8 of the task force.

9 "(11)(a) The task force shall submit a report in the manner provided 10 by ORS 192.245, and shall include recommendations for legislation de-11 scribed in subsection (3) of this section, to the appropriate interim 12 committee of the Legislative Assembly related to transportation no 13 later than September 15, 2018.

"(b) The task force may submit a report in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and may include recommendations for legislation, if any, resulting from the task force's study under subsection (4) of this section, to the appropriate interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related to transportation no later than September 15, 2019.

"(12) The Department of Transportation shall provide staff support
 to the task force.

"(13) Members of the Legislative Assembly appointed to the task force are nonvoting members of the task force and may act in an advisory capacity only.

"(14) Members of the task force who are not members of the Leg islative Assembly are not entitled to compensation or reimbursement
 for expenses and serve as volunteers on the task force.

"(15) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist the task force in the performance of the task force's duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish information and advice the members of the 1 task force consider necessary to perform their duties.

2 "SECTION 3. Section 2 of this 2018 Act is repealed on January 2,
3 2021.

<u>"SECTION 4.</u> This 2018 Act being necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is
declared to exist, and this 2018 Act takes effect on its passage.".

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
