## PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 4129

- On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, delete "192.566,".
- In line 12, delete "shall" and insert "may".
- Delete lines 20 through 28 and insert:
- 4 "(5) Has not been convicted of a crime described in ORS 443.004;
- 5 "(6) Pays a licensure fee; and
- 6 "(7) Passes an examination described in section 3 of this 2018 Act.
- 7 "SECTION 3. (1) The Long Term Care Administrators Board shall:
- 8 "(a) Approve at least one examination for licensure as a residential 9 care facility administrator;
- 10 "(b) Ensure that the examinations are available to applicants at 11 multiple times throughout the year; and
- "(c) Ensure that at least one examination approved by the board is available to be taken online.
- "(2) An applicant for licensure under section 2 of this 2018 Act shall
  pay an examination or reexamination fee established by the Health
  Licensing Office under ORS 676.576.

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- 18 "(a) Determine the subjects, scope and content of the examinations;
- 19 "(b) Ensure the examinations are specific to Oregon law, adminis-20 trative rules and best practices; and
  - "(c) Determine a passing score for each examination approved by

- 1 the board.".

- On page 3, line 40, after "care" insert "or care for persons with disabilities".
- 5 On page 5, after line 28, insert:
- "SECTION 12. The Long Term Care Administrators Board may not carry out a disciplinary action against an individual who holds a license under ORS 678.710 to 678.820 unless at least one board member who represents the type of license held by the individual attends all meetings related to the disciplinary action."
- Delete lines 32 through 45.
- Delete pages 6 and 7.

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- On page 8, delete lines 1 through 38.
- On page 19, delete lines 41 through 45 and delete page 20 insert:
- "SECTION 27. (1) Not later than January 1, 2019, the Health Licensing Office and the Long Term Care Administrators Board shall ensure that the members of the board meet the membership requirements established in ORS 678.800, as amended by section 9 of this 2018 Act.
  - "(2) Not later than December 31, 2019, the board shall approve the examinations for licensure as a residential care facility administrator described in section 3 of this 2018 Act.
  - "SECTION 28. (1) Not later than July 1, 2019, an individual who is employed in Oregon as a residential care facility administrator, as defined in ORS 678.710, shall apply to the Health Licensing Office on a form created by the office for a residential care facility administrator license. The office may issue a license under this section to an applicant who:
- 29 "(a) Is at least 21 years of age;
- 30 "(b) Has earned at least a high school diploma or its equivalent;

- "(c) Has been employed in Oregon as a residential care facility administrator for the four years immediately preceding the date of application;
- "(d) Has met the requirements for training and continuing education established by the office by rule for the three years immediately preceding the date of application;
- "(e) Is in good standing with the office, and any residential care facility for which the person has been responsible has not been subject to conditions imposed by the Department of Human Services while the person was responsible for the residential care facility;
  - "(f) Has not been convicted of a crime described in ORS 443.004; and "(g) Pays the licensure fee established by the office by rule.
    - "(2) The office may issue a provisional residential care facility administrator license to an individual who applies for licensure under this section and who is employed in Oregon as a residential care facility administrator but who does not meet all the requirements of subsection (1)(c) to (e) of this section. An individual described in this subsection must earn a passing score on an examination described in section 3 of this 2018 Act on or before December 31, 2021.
    - "(3) The office may issue a provisional residential care facility administrator license to an individual who is not employed in Oregon as a residential care facility administrator but who meets the requirements of section 2 (1) to (5) of this 2018 Act. An individual described in this subsection must earn a passing score on an examination described in section 3 of this 2018 Act on or before December 31, 2021.
  - "(4) An individual who applies for a provisional license under subsection (2) or (3) of this section must pay the provisional licensure fee established by the office by rule.
- "(5) An individual issued a license or a provisional license under this section shall:

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- "(a) Submit to the office sufficient proof that the individual has 1 completed a tuberculosis screening with a satisfactory result; and 2 "(b) Meet the requirements for training and continuing education 3 established by the office by rule. 4 "(6) A provisional residential care facility administrator license is-5 sued under this section is not renewable and expires on the earlier of 6 December 31, 2021, or the date upon which the holder is issued a li-7 cense under section 2 of this 2018 Act. 8 "(7) Licenses and provisional licenses issued under this section are 9 subject to the provisions of ORS 678.790. 10 "(8) Moneys collected under this section shall be paid into the 11 General Fund and credited to the Health Licensing Office Account es-12 tablished under ORS 676.625. 13 "(9) The office may adopt rules to carry out the requirements of 14 this section, and may consult with the department in establishing any 15 standards under this section. 16 "SECTION 29. (1) Section 27 of this 2018 Act is repealed on January 17 2, 2020. 18 "(2) Section 28 of this 2018 Act is repealed on January 2, 2022. 19 20 "CAPTIONS 21 22 "SECTION 30. "SECTION 32. This 2018 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2018 Act takes effect on its passage."
