PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 4029

(1) The Task Force on Recreation Along the Deschutes 4 Scenic Waterway is established. 5"(2) The task force consists of 12 members appointed by the Gover-6 nor as follows: 7 "(a) One member who is recommended to the Governor by the al-8 ternative dispute resolution section of the Oregon State Bar with ex-9 perience resolving natural resource issues; 10 "(b) One member with expertise in fish or riparian issues and who 11 12represents an environmental organization; "(c) One member with expertise in wildlife or terrestrial issues and 13 who represents an environmental organization; 14 "(d) One member representing outdoor recreation interests; 15 "(e) One member representing outdoor education interests; 16 "(f) One member representing neighborhood interests in Bend or 17 Sunriver: 18 "(g) One member recommended by the State Department of Fish 19 and Wildlife; 20"(h) One member recommended by the State Parks and Recreation 21

1 **Department;**

2 "(i) One member recommended by the City of Bend;

3 "(j) One member recommended by Deschutes County;

4 "(k) One member recommended by the Bend Park and Recreation
5 District; and

6 "(L) One member appointed in consultation with the United States
7 Forest Service.

"(3) In making appointments to the task force, the Governor shall,
to the extent possible, appoint individuals who live or recreate in the
Bend or Sunriver areas.

11 **"(4) The task force shall:**

"(a) Develop options for a recreational trail alignment along or near
 the Deschutes River from Sunriver through Bend, taking into consid eration the following:

15 "(A) The goal of achieving a net benefit to fish and wildlife;

"(B) The role of the local communities to manage recreational ac tivities along the river; and

"(C) The need to balance recreation, transportation and the con servation of fish and wildlife habitat;

"(b) Identify any state regulations that must be changed to accom plish the proposed trail alignment; and

"(c) Provide an evaluation of past, present and future conditions
 affecting the Deschutes Scenic Waterway and identify anticipated ec ological impacts of the proposed trail alignment.

"(5) In making the recommendations under subsection (4) of this
section, the task force shall incorporate, to the extent possible, any
prior studies or planning on similar issues affecting scenic waterways
that have been conducted by state or local bodies.

"(6) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a
 quorum for the transaction of business.

1 "(7) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a 2 majority of the members of the task force.

"(8) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as
chairperson.

5 "(9) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority 6 shall make an appointment to become immediately effective.

"(10) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the
call of the chairperson or of a majority of the members of the task
force.

"(11) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation
 of the task force.

"(12) The task force shall submit a report in the manner provided
 in ORS 192.245, and may include recommendations for legislation, to
 the appropriate joint legislative committee no later than September
 15, 2019.

"(13) The State Parks and Recreation Department shall provide staff
 support to the task force.

"(14) Members of the task force are not entitled to compensation
 or reimbursement for expenses and serve as volunteers on the task
 force.

"(15) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist the task force in the performance of duties of the task force and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish information and advice the members of the task force consider necessary to perform their duties.

26 "SECTION 2. A person, a public body as defined in ORS 174.109 or 27 a local service district as defined in ORS 174.116 may not construct a 28 bridge on the Deschutes River within that portion of the Deschutes 29 Scenic Waterway established under ORS 390.826 (5) beginning at the 30 Deschutes National Forest boundary in section 20, township 19 south,
