HB 2519

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/27/2019 AGENDA: Requires community colleges and universities operating in this state that receive state financial aid to adopt written policy on hazing, provide on-campus policy training on hazing and annually report to Higher Education Coordinating Commission number of hazing incidents reported and investigated by community college or university during previous academic year.

HB 2910

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/27/2019 AGENDA: Requires that for person who completes prior educational requirements to participate in Oregon Promise program while incarcerated or detained, six-month period to enroll in courses to participate in program begins after person's period of incarceration or detention has ended.

Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

HB 2871

Directs Higher Education Coordinating Commission to conduct study to determine what additional actions are necessary to meet 40-40-20 goals.

HB 3015

Permits former adopted foster children to have amount of tuition and all fees waived if attending defined institutions of higher education for purposes of pursuing initial undergraduate degree.

HB 3020

Requires public schools to make available, at no cost, menstrual products in at least 50 percent of bathrooms at schools with students in any grade from grade 7 through 12.

HB 3236 **

Directs Department of Education to implement assessment system that limits number of content-based assessments and criterion-referenced assessments and to encourage school districts to use performance-based assessments.

HB 2021 **

Directs Department of Education to provide moneys for payment of costs of education of students in eligible residential alternative education program.

- HB 2023
Directs State Board of Education to ensure that academic content standards for certain subjects include sufficient instruction on histories, contributions and perspectives of certain classifications of individuals.
- HB 2030
Renames Oregon Youth Conservation Corps Advisory Committee as Oregon Youth Conservation Corps Advisory Board.
- HB 2224 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Student Success
Directs Department of Education to distribute grants for improving student outcomes by supporting social, emotional, mental and physical health needs of students.
- HB 2326 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Student Success
Provides funding for grant program under which Department of Education awards grants to school districts for percentage of certain student transportation costs for which school district does not receive any amount in distributions from State School Fund or any amount related to transit activities.
- HB 2571 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Provides that current or former foster child under 25 years of age is eligible for tuition waiver at institution of higher education if current or former foster child is enrolled in courses totaling one or more credit hours for purposes of pursuing initial undergraduate degree.
- HB 2897 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Student Success
Establishes Early Childhood Equity Fund.
- HB 2902 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Student Success
Requires school district to report on number of incidents during which students of classroom were removed from classroom because other student in classroom was acting in manner that would threaten to injure other person or to damage school property.

Note change: HB 2519 and HB 2910 have been carried over from the 3/27/2019 agenda. HB 3257 has been removed from the agenda.
