Work Session

- HB 2496
Includes battery storage in definition of "green energy technology." Defines "total contract price." Permits contracting agency, as alternative to including green energy technology in construction, reconstruction or major renovation of public building, to make expenditure to improve energy use efficiency in public building.
- HB 2509
Prohibits use of single-use checkout bags except in certain cases.
- HB 2618 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Requires State Department of Energy to adopt by rule program for providing rebates for purchase, construction or installation of residential and commercial solar electric systems and paired solar and storage systems.
- HB 2819 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Requires Water Resources Department to establish pilot program to make conserved Columbia River water available to holder of water right in critical ground water area in exchange for holder reducing appropriation of ground water.
- HB 2853
Requires Water Resources Department to maintain registry of historic-use reservoirs.
- HB 2856 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-28 AGENDA: Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Water Resources Department to study ground water in this state.
- HB 2860 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Requires Oregon Health Authority to analyze ground water contaminant data and provide education in areas with ground water contaminant problems.
- HB 2883 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Prohibits food vendor from using polystyrene container in selling, offering for sale, serving or dispensing prepared food to public.
- HB 3065
Directs Public Utility Commission to establish public process for investigating continuing relevance of telecommunications carrier of last resort obligations.
- HB 3114
Makes changes to requirements for recycling certain electronic devices.

- HB 2322
Requires Land Conservation and Development Commission to amend statewide land use planning goals related to energy to incorporate development of renewable energy facilities and reduction of greenhouse gas emissions and to match state energy policies.
- HB 2494
Extends operation of public purpose charges until January 1, 2036.
- HB 3055
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-28 AGENDA: Prohibits sale of mattress or children's product that incorporates or bears specified chemicals unless person affixes or attaches warning to mattress or children's product.
- HB 3094 **
Establishes Home Weatherization, Retrofit and Affordability Program for Housing and Community Services Department to provide incentive payments to construction contractors undertaking energy improvement projects on residential structures. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- HB 3141
Modifies and adds laws related to electric vehicle charging stations.
- HB 3157
Requires Director of Department of Consumer and Business Services to amend Low-Rise Residential Dwelling Code to require alternative energy collection or generation by December 15, 2020.
- HB 3408
Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Environmental Quality for deposit in Residential Solid Fuel Heating Air Quality Improvement Fund to fund community efforts to promote economic development and improve public health by reducing emissions from solid fuel burning devices that burn wood.
