Work Session

- HB 2007 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Directs Environmental Quality Commission to adopt by rule diesel engine emission standards for medium-duty trucks and heavy-duty trucks.
- HB 2857
Requires eight percent of electricity sold in this state by each electric company that makes sales to 25,000 or more retail electricity consumers to be generated by small-scale renewable energy facilities or certain biomass facilities.
- HB 3062 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Revenue
Extends sunset date for exemption from use fuel tax for diesel fuel blended with at least 20 percent biodiesel derived from used cooking oil.
- HB 3182
Requires permit for construction, installation or operation of system for on-site treatment and reuse of nonpotable water.
- HB 3274
Requires eight percent of electricity sold in this state by each electric company that makes sales to 25,000 or more retail electricity consumers to be generated by small-scale renewable energy facilities or certain biomass facilities.
- HB 3326 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Declares harmful algal blooms to be menace to public health and welfare.

Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

- HB 3248
Provides that county prohibition, restriction, limitation or regulation of certain open burning applies throughout county unless county court or board of county commissioners expressly states otherwise.

HB 3407

Authorizes electric companies that are subject to renewable portfolio standards to offer to purchase qualifying electricity generated by certain hydroelectric facilities.
