#### Public Hearing

- HB 2244 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Establishes CourtCare Fund and appropriates moneys in fund to Department of Education for distribution to counties to operate CourtCare programs.
- HB 2338  
Directs Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to conduct study on criminal sentencing outcomes and present report on findings to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to judiciary on or before September 15, 2020.
- HB 2399  
Authorizes court to impose compensatory fine without imposing any other fine as part of criminal sentence.
- HB 3261  
Modifies requirement to record peace officer's interview with person under 18 years of age to include interviews of investigations into misdemeanors, felonies and acts that, if committed by adult, would constitute crimes and require recorded interviews whenever person under 18 years of age would reasonably believe person is in custody.
- HB 3300  
Directs Department of Corrections to conduct study on provision of treatment services to persons in custody of department and present report on findings to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to judiciary on or before September 15, 2020.

#### Work Session

- HB 2395  
Requires person that manufactures, sells or offers to sell connected device to equip connected device with reasonable security features that protect information that connected device collects, contains, stores or transmits from access, destruction, modification, use or disclosure that consumer does not authorize.
- HB 3047  
Modifies juvenile court dependency procedure to require any party issuing summons to bear financial responsibility for certain costs arising out of issuance of summons.
- HB 3146  
Changes statutory references to "inmate" to "adult in custody."

- HB 3164 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Directs Public Defense Services Commission to distribute moneys to Metropolitan Public Defender Services for establishment and administration of pilot program according to specifications, collection of certain program data and submission of data to commission.
- HB 3388 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Modifies annual salaries of judges of Supreme Court, Court of Appeals, circuit courts and Oregon Tax Court.
