Public Hearing and Work Session

SB 359

Provides structure and procedures by which business corporation and nonprofit corporation may ratify and approve defective corporate actions.

SB 362

Requires defendant to file notice of intent to introduce evidence of mental defense at least 45 days before trial.

SB 596

Provides that if person reports commission of person felony to emergency communications system or law enforcement agency, evidence of prostitution obtained as result of making report may not be used against person in prosecution for prostitution or attempted prostitution.

SB 597 A

Authorizes use of pseudonym, initials or other signifier instead of name of victim, or witness if witness is also victim, in indictment when specified requirements are met.

SB 684 A

Specifies requirements for covered entities that own, license, maintain, store, manage, collect, process, acquire or otherwise possess personal information, and for vendors that provide services to covered entities, to notify consumers of breach of security.

Work Session

SB 31 A

Permits Oregon Public Guardian and Conservator to establish county, regional and statewide high-risk teams to identify options available for addressing safety risks facing highly vulnerable adults.

SB 360 A

Updates laws that govern nonprofit corporations in this state.

SB 686 A

Allows athlete agents to pay for certain expenses in connection with recruiting and signing student athletes.
