SB 726 A

Makes unlawful employment practice for employer to enter agreement that would prevent employee from disclosing or discussing conduct that constitutes unlawful discrimination, including sexual assault.

SB 318 A

Permits court to order equal parenting time when developing detailed parenting plan.

SB 356

Permits detailed parenting plan to include instructions regarding notification requirements for specified matters. SB 385 A
