#### Public Hearing

- SB 597 A  
Authorizes use of pseudonym, initials or other signifier instead of name of victim, or witness if witness is also victim, in indictment when specified requirements are met.
- SB 708  
Exempts petitioner in stalking protective order proceeding from requirement to pay prevailing party fee unless court finds petitioner initiated proceeding with malicious intent.
- SB 725 A  
Specifies charges or convictions that may not be considered in fitness determinations.
- SB 775 A  
Requires agencies of state government to use Department of State Police for purposes of requesting criminal records checks relating to employment by agency.
- SB 995 A  
Modifies provisions relating to restraining orders.

#### Work Session

- SB 269 A  
Directs Department of Corrections to provide audit report prescribed by Prison Rape Elimination Act of 2003 to Legislative Assembly no later than February 1 following completion of audit report.
- SB 318 A  
Permits court to order equal parenting time when developing detailed parenting plan.
- SB 356  
Permits detailed parenting plan to include instructions regarding notification requirements for specified matters.
- SB 385 A  
Allows presiding judge of each judicial district to establish alternative dispute resolution conference procedure for custody and parenting time modifications and enforcement proceedings.
- SB 474  
Modifies length of time of parental desertion or abandonment of child resulting in forfeiture of parent's intestate share of child's estate and parent's interest in property transferred from child to parent by transfer on death deed.

SB 962 A

Directs certifying agencies to certify to United States Citizenship and Immigration Services, within specified time, victim helpfulness in detecting, investigating or prosecuting qualifying criminal activity.
