SB 362

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 5/21/2019 1PM AGENDA: Requires defendant to file notice of intent to introduce evidence of mental defense at least 45 days before trial.

SB 396

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 5/21/2019 1PM AGENDA: Establishes alternative procedure for use by owner, operator or employee of fuel dispensary to obtain removal of vehicle preventing or hindering access to fuel dispensing equipment.

SB 420 A

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 5/21/2019 1PM AGENDA: Establishes procedures for persons with qualifying marijuana convictions to file motion requesting court to enter order setting aside conviction.

SB 474

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 5/21/2019 1PM AGENDA: Modifies length of time of parental desertion or abandonment of child resulting in forfeiture of parent's intestate share of child's estate and parent's interest in property transferred from child to parent by transfer on death deed.

SB 478 A

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 5/21/2019 1PM AGENDA: Prohibits campaign moneys and public moneys from being used to make payments in connection with nondisclosure agreement relating to workplace harassment .

SB 479 A

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 5/21/2019 1PM AGENDA: Requires public employers to adopt policies to prevent workplace harassment.

SB 597 Â

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 5/21/2019 1PM AGENDA: Authorizes use of pseudonym, initials or other signifier instead of name of victim, or witness if witness is also victim, in indictment when specified requirements are met.

SB 708

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 5/21/2019 1PM AGENDA: Exempts petitioner in stalking protective order proceeding from requirement to pay prevailing party fee unless court finds petitioner initiated proceeding with malicious intent.

SB 725 A

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 5/21/2019 1PM AGENDA: Specifies charges or convictions that may not be considered in fitness determinations.

SB 775 A

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 5/21/2019 1PM AGENDA: Requires agencies of state government to use Department of State Police for purposes of requesting criminal records checks relating to employment by agency.

SB 810

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 5/21/2019 1PM AGENDA: Modifies definition of "vulnerable user of a public way" to include persons operating or riding on moped or motorcycle.

SB 975 A

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 5/21/2019 1PM AGENDA: Establishes procedures for persons with marijuana convictions to file motion requesting court to reduce offense classification if, since entry of judgment of conviction, offense classification has been reduced.

SB 995 A

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 5/21/2019 1PM AGENDA: Modifies provisions relating to restraining orders. SB 999 A

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 5/21/2019 1PM AGENDA: Modifies provisions requiring person to be informed about rights and consequences relating to driving under the influence of intoxicants.

SB 1040 A

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 5/21/2019 1PM AGENDA: Makes owner, operator or lessee of quarry or mine located on property adjacent to Willamette River in Polk County and across river from City of Keizer liable for injuries resulting from bullets that stray outside boundaries of property if, after being notified that bullets have strayed, owner, operator or lessee fails to take reasonable measures to prevent additional bullets from straying.
