HB 3081 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Directs Oregon Department of Administrative Services to distribute moneys to Klamath County to acquire and install stream gauges in Klamath Basin.

Work Session

HB 2361 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Requires State Fish and Wildlife Commission to establish and prescribe fees for multiyear resident and nonresident hunting licenses.

HB 2377 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Oregon Department of Administrative Services for payment to Douglas Timber Operators for purpose of implementing first phase of sediment study of lower Rogue River.

HB 2747
Revises requirements for membership on State Fish and Wildlife Commission.

HB 2923
Classifies certain persons as resident persons for purpose of purchasing licenses, tags and permits issued by State Fish and Wildlife Commission.

HB 3227 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Establishes Excessive Elk Damage Pilot Program.

HB 3168
Authorizes operation of boats propelled by electric motors on named lakes and waters of this state under certain circumstances.

HB 3035 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Judiciary
Increases maximum penalty for certain wildlife law offenses committed without culpable mental state to \$2,000 fine.

HB 3087 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Directs State Department of Fish and Wildlife to establish anti-poaching awareness program.
