Work Session

- SB 2
Allows listed eastern Oregon counties that undertake economic opportunity analysis to designate up to 50 acres outside urban growth boundaries for industrial and other employment uses notwithstanding statewide planning goals related to agriculture, forest use or urbanization.
- SB 49
Exempts from Public Contracting Code timber sales from lands that State Parks and Recreation Commission or State Parks and Recreation Department owns or manages.
- SB 241 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Finance and Revenue then to Tax Expenditures
Extends sunset for tax credit for crop donation.

Public Hearing

- SB 259 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Establishes Task Force on Maritime Sector Workforce Development.
- SB 260
Requires State Department of Fish and Wildlife to establish program for strategic investments in initiatives related to ocean acidification and hypoxia.
- SB 753 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Authorizes executive director of Oregon Ocean Science Trust to enter into agreement with private, nonprofit organization under which organization shall solicit gifts, grants and donations in support of work of trust.
