Public Hearing

SB 698

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 03/06/2019 AGENDA: Requires pharmacists to label prescription drugs in language other than English if patient to whom prescription drug is dispensed is person of limited English proficiency.

Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

SB 911 **

Requires health benefit plans, state medical assistance program, Public Employees' Benefit Board and Oregon Educators Benefit Board to pay for standard fertility preservation services for covered individual who will undergo medical treatment that is likely to result in iatrogenic infertility.

SB 242

Requires health benefit plan coverage of pregnancy care for surrogate mothers.

SB 749

Requires health benefit plans to cover fertility and reproductive endocrinology services.

SB 142

Changes "venereal disease" and "sexually transmitted disease" to "sexually transmitted infection." Changes "human immunodeficiency virus" and "acquired immune deficiency syndrome" to "blood-borne pathogen.".

Work Session

SB 23

Requires hospitals to submit emergency department discharge abstract records to Oregon Health Authority or to entity contracting with authority to compile records.

SB 128

Directs Board of Medical Imaging to issue permit to supervise fluoroscopy to qualified advanced practice registered nurse.

SB 742

Directs Health Licensing Office to issue license to engage in practice of athletic training to qualified applicant.
