SB 872

CARRIED OVER FROM 03/20/2019 AGENDA: Requires pharmaceutical manufacturers to report to Department of Consumer and Business Services total cost of patient assistance programs and information on financial assistance provided to pharmacies, government agencies and advocacy organizations.

Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

SB 889

Establishes Health Care Cost Growth Benchmark program to control growth of health care expenditures in this state.

SB 841 **

Requires Oregon Health Authority to compile health care expenditure report concerning expenditures related to medical assistance, Medicare, commercial insurance and self-insurance. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

SB 900 **

Imposes requirements on outpatient dialysis treatment facility, or entity that has financial interest in outpatient dialysis treatment facility, that pays health insurance premiums for patients of outpatient dialysis treatment facility. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

SB 137

Prohibits coordinated care organization from contracting with any entity to assume risk of providing behavioral health services or to assume responsibility for utilization management, care coordination, denials of service, grievances or appeals.

Work Session

SB 138

Reestablishes Mental Health Clinical Advisory Group in Oregon Health Authority to continue development of evidence-based algorithms for prescription drug treatment of mental health disorders.

SB 134

Requires coordinated care organizations to develop standardized system of care to use when assessing individuals.

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SB 177

Requires hospice program licensed by Oregon Health Authority to identify patients in need of palliative care, provide information to patients, residents and families of patients about palliative care and facilitate patient access to palliative care.
