- SB 911 **
CARRIED OVER FROM 03/27/2019 AGENDA: Requires health benefit plans, state medical assistance program, Public Employees' Benefit Board and Oregon Educators Benefit Board to pay for standard fertility preservation services for covered individual who will undergo medical treatment that is likely to result in iatrogenic infertility. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- SB 179
CARRIED OVER FROM 03/27/2019 AGENDA: Requires Department of Human Services to administer palliative care pilot project to support provision of community-based end of life care.
- SB 131 **
Requires Director of Oregon Health Authority to appoint Children's Health Advocate to investigate complaints and take steps to ensure access to and reimbursement of timely health care for children placed by Department of Human Services in private child-caring agencies. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Human Services
- SB 452
Directs Oregon Health Authority to develop triage, treatment and transportation protocols for patients who carry emergency use medications.
- SB 796
Makes period of absence for donation of body part, organ or tissue "serious health condition" for which family leave may be taken.

- SB 824
Requires Oregon Board of Dentistry to accept examination results of applicant's fitness to practice dentistry from board-recognized testing agencies.
- SB 795
Prescribes requirements for Oregon Deaf and Hard-of-Hearing Services Program.
- SB 835
Allows dentist to advertise practice in specialty area of dentistry.
- SB 141
Requires Oregon Health Authority to establish or contract for establishment of statewide mental health crisis support access line to facilitate specified services for individuals experiencing behavioral health crises.

- SB 127
Requires physician assistants who practice medicine full-time to receive eight hours of supervision each month.

- SB 770 **
Establishes Health Care for All Oregon Board to be responsible for planning and oversight of Health Care for All Oregon Plan to be administered by Oregon Health Authority. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- SB 841 **
CARRIED OVER FROM 03/25/2019 AGENDA: Requires Oregon Health Authority to compile health care expenditure report concerning expenditures related to medical assistance, Medicare, commercial insurance and self-insurance. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- SB 867
Declares legislative findings for best system for delivery and financing of health care.
