Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

- SB 1030
Requires Oregon Health Authority to make publicly available specified information about payments to and expenditures by coordinated care organizations, authority and Department of Human Services.
- SB 1041
Grants to Oregon Health Authority powers to regulate financial condition of coordinated care organizations that align with powers of Department of Consumer and Business Services to regulate domestic insurers.
- SB 808 **
Directs Oregon Health Authority and specified professional regulatory boards to require licensees regulated by authority or board to complete continuing education related to suicide risk assessment, treatment and management and to report completion of continuing education to authority or board. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- SB 1027
Allows certain health care practitioner who receives needlestick injury during provision of medical care to patient who is unconscious or otherwise unable to consent to test patient for human immunodeficiency virus for purpose of determining necessary course of treatment for health care practitioner.
- SJM 2
Urges members of Oregon Congressional Delegation to cosponsor or endorse State-Based Universal Health Care Act of 2018.

Work Session

- SB 133
Directs Oregon Health Authority to develop training for frontline behavioral health providers.
- SB 139
Imposes restrictions and reporting requirements for utilization management of health services by commercial insurers, coordinated care organizations and state medical assistance program.
- SB 242
Requires health benefit plan coverage of pregnancy care for surrogate mothers.

- SB 250
Adopts Fry Graph Readability Formula for health insurance policies and materials approved by Department of Consumer and Business Services.
- SB 253
Authorizes Public Health Officer to appoint local health officer in certain counties.
- SB 409
Directs State Board of Pharmacy to develop program to allow wholesale importation of prescription drugs into Oregon.
- SB 698
Requires pharmacists to label prescription drugs in language other than English if patient to whom prescription drug is dispensed is person of limited English proficiency.
- SB 735
Requires health outcome and quality measures adopted by Health Plan Quality Metrics Committee to include hospital measures and to be applied to health benefit plans sold in this state, not to only health benefit plans sold through health insurance exchange or covering public employees.
- SB 765
Modifies definitions of "primary care" and "total medical expenditures" for purpose of reports on spending for primary care by insurance carriers, Public Employees' Benefit Board, Oregon Educators Benefit Board and coordinated care organizations.
- SB 823 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Workforce
Makes it unlawful employment practice for health care employer to retaliate against employee who makes good faith report of assault that occurred on premises of health care provider or in home of patient receiving home health care services.
- SB 910
Narrows siting restrictions on methadone clinics to clinics providing outpatient treatment.
- SB 144
Makes certain provisions relating to anatomical gifts applicable to gifts of whole body.
- SB 588
Establishes Outdoor Therapy Grant Program within State Parks and Recreation Department for purpose of awarding grants to enhance outdoor environmental, ecological, agricultural or other natural resource-based therapy programs serving residents of this state.
- SB 780
Directs Public Employees' Benefit Board and Oregon Educators Benefit Board to establish pilot program allowing public employees to obtain health services from coordinated care organizations.
- SB 887
Requires insurer, Public Employees' Benefit Board and Oregon Educators Benefit Board to cover specified health services without prior authorization in health benefit plans and benefit plans offered by insurer or board.
- SB 900 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Imposes requirements on outpatient dialysis treatment facility, or entity that has financial interest in outpatient dialysis treatment facility, that pays health insurance premiums for patients of outpatient dialysis treatment facility.
- SB 941 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Oregon Department of Administrative Services for distribution to Curry Health District for purposes of acquiring ambulance for maternity care and opening emergency room in Curry Medical Center.
- SB 815 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Requires memory care facilities and assisted living facilities to provide written notice to applicants for admission and to current residents at specified times regarding services, rates, staffing and eligibility or of changes to services, rates, staffing or eligibility.
