**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Youth Development Division to provide grants to certain communitybased youth development programs.

SB 1035 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means CARRIED OVER FROM 4/4/19 AGENDA: Requires Oregon Health Authority and Department of Human Services to design program for providing limited benefit package of financial assistance, services and supports to individuals who receive care from family members, friends or neighbors who are not compensated for providing care.

SB 1036 **

******Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means CARRIED OVER FROM 4/4/19 AGENDA: Establishes Office of Oregon Ombudsmen to provide administrative services and support to Office of the Long Term Care Ombudsman, Office of the Residential Facilities Ombudsman, Office of the Foster Parent Ombudsman, Office of the Foster Child Ombudsman and Office of the Oregon Public Guardian and Conservator

SB 1039

CARRIED OVER FROM 4/4/19 AGENDA: Authorizes appointment of health care advocate to make health care decisions for individual with developmental disability receiving services through individualized written service plan if individual does not have guardian or health care representative.

SB 917 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

CARRIED OVER FROM 4/4/19 AGENDA: Prohibits long term care facilities, residential facilities, adult foster homes, child care facilities, child-caring agencies, foster homes, youth care centers, youth offender foster homes or other entities that are licensed, certified or registered to provide care to children, youth, individuals with disabilities or older adults from interfering with disclosure of information by prospective employees, employees or volunteers about treatment of individuals cared for by entity to regulatory agencies, law enforcement authorities or persons acting on behalf of individual.

SB 825 **

******Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

CARRIED OVER FROM 4/4/19 AGENDA: Directs Department of Human Services to study and make recommendations on provisions of state law relating to placement of children in child-caring agencies.

SB 20

CARRIED OVER FROM 4/4/19 AGENDA: Consolidates eligibility for services to children and adults with developmental disabilities.

SB 809 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Judiciary then to Ways and Means CARRIED OVER FROM 4/4/19 AGENDA: Requires Department of Human Services and Oregon Health Authority to prescribe by rule criteria for making fitness determinations.

SB 832 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means CARRIED OVER FROM 4/4/19 AGENDA: Declares purpose of Critical Incident Review Teams.

SB 669

Modifies requirements for licensing of in-home care agencies.

SB 475

Directs Department of Human Services to conduct monthly, in-person visits with child or ward in substitute care that include updates on academic status and progress.

SB 490

Adds individuals who have operated child care facility in violation of child care facility or Central Background Registry law to list of individuals who are prohibited from providing child care for five years.

SB 493

Establishes Oregon Human Rights Commission to safeguard dignity and basic human rights of individuals with intellectual or developmental disabilities.
