SUMMARY

Directs State Department of Fish and Wildlife to create pilot program that allows persons to use dogs for hunting, or nonlethal pursuit of, cougars within county electing to participate in pilot-program. Directs department to report to interim committee of Legislative Assembly.

Sunsets program January 2, 2026.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to a pilot program for cougar management.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. (1) Notwithstanding ORS 498.164, the State Department 4 of Fish and Wildlife shall create a pilot program that allows persons $\mathbf{5}$ 6 to use dogs in the hunting and in the nonlethal pursuit of cougars within a county that elects to participate in the pilot program. The 7 department shall designate wildlife management areas of the following 8 counties as areas in which, subject to elector approval at a county-9 wide election, the use of dogs in the hunting and in the nonlethal 10 pursuit of cougars is allowed: 11

(a) Umatilla, Wallowa, Union, Baker, Grant, Douglas, Coos, Curry,
 Josephine, Jackson, Linn and Marion; and

(b) Any county not specified in paragraph (a) of this subsection
 that, on or after June 30, 2022, approves a ballot measure for inclusion
 in the pilot program.

(2) The pilot program shall allow for separate hunting and nonlethal
 pursuit seasons within each county participating in the pilot program.
 (3) The State Fish and Wildlife Commission shall adopt rules to

implement the pilot program described in this section. Rules adopted
by the commission to implement the pilot program shall:

3 (a) Be designed to protect public safety, property and game mam4 mals;

5 (b) Be designed to generate data that is necessary for the depart-6 ment to develop the report required by section 2 of this 2019 Act;

7 (c) Reflect the current and future predictions of cougar populations;
8 (d) Reflect the current and future predictions of game mammal
9 populations and rates of taking of game mammals by licensed hunters;
10 and

(e) Be designed to ensure that the number of cougars prescribed for
 taking under ORS 496.162 is met.

(4) The commission shall issue cougar tags on an equal footing to
persons in counties that participate in the pilot program and persons
in counties that do not participate in the pilot program. However, the
commission may limit the number of cougars that may be taken in
order to ensure that the wildlife policy goals of ORS 496.012 are met.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> The State Department of Fish and Wildlife shall submit a report in the manner provided in ORS 192.245, and may include recommendations for legislation, to an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related to fish and wildlife no later than September 15, 2024. The report shall be on the pilot program conducted pursuant to section 1 of this 2019 Act and shall contain:

(1) The names of the counties electing to participate in the pilot
 program.

(2) Information on the efficacy of the pilot program with regard to
cougar population management and a recommendation as to whether
the pilot program should be made permanent or should be extended.
The department shall provide the information on a county-by-county
basis and may also provide the information on a statewide or regional
basis.

1 (3) A summary of the population data collected during the pilot 2 program.

3 (4) A recommendation for the development of a comprehensive and
4 effective reporting system for people to report encounters with and
5 sightings of cougars, bears and wolves.

6 (5) A recommendation for a cougar population management system
 7 that focuses on controlling the population level.

8 (6) Identification of nonlethal means that would decrease encount9 ers between humans and cougars.

(7) A summary of deer and elk population status during the pilot
 program in comparison with the 10 years prior to the implementation
 of the pilot program.

(8) A summary of any relevant elk predation or nutrition research
 conducted by the department.

15 <u>SECTION 3.</u> Sections 1 and 2 of this 2019 Act are repealed on Jan 16 uary 2, 2026.

17 <u>SECTION 4.</u> The governing body of each county identified in section 18 1 (1)(a) of this 2019 Act shall place on the ballot at an election to be 19 held in 2020 on a date specified in ORS 203.085 (1) a county measure 20 asking the electors of the county whether the county shall participate 21 in a State Department of Fish and Wildlife pilot program allowing the 22 use of dogs in the hunting and in the nonlethal pursuit of cougars.
