Emerging issues

- Compliance with sex offender risk assessment deadline of December 1, 2022 (Senate Bill 767, 2017) exceeds the agency's existing resources
 - Roughly 27,000 existing sex offenders await assessment
 - During the first year of the 2017-19 biennium, the Board classified just over 2,200 offenders
- Need for relocation from the Dome Building
- Analyzing data and reporting Key Performance Measures

- The budget is primarily General Fund with nominal amounts of Other Funds
- The Governor's Budget supports current services with investments in:
 - > Five Board Assessment Specialists
 - > One half-time Victims Specialist
- Budget adjustments include:
 - Statewide updates to the AG rate, DAS Price List and State Government Services Charges
 - > Limited inflation on some accounts
 - > Assumes vacancy savings of 8 percent
