- Budget Reductions:
 - DAS' role as a service provider means reductions can affect other state agencies downstream
 - Focus on reducing costs to customers rather than reducing core functions
 - Reduced working capital from 60 days to 30 days, saving \$21.1 million in total funds
 - Reduced \$19.6 million in Other Funds costs, 5 positions (5.00 FTE) through efficiencies, eliminating non-core functions, and lower inflationary adjustments

Other Funds

- DAS program revenues come from state agencies or local government customers
 - Assessments pay for policy functions
 - Charges for service pay for service delivery functions
- Lottery Funds
 - > DAS administers the Economic Development Fund, makes transfers to the Education Stability Fund, Parks and Natural Resources Fund, Veterans Services Fund, and the Oregon Education Fund

General Fund

 Funds the Office of Economic Analysis, CASA, Public Records Advocate Office, payment of Debt Service, and pass-through payments to non-governmental entities. Dept. of Administrative Services 2019-21 Governor's Budget



- Governor's Budget makes various reductions to meet General Fund constraints, alongside targeted investments.
- Major Investments:
 - > Procurement System Replacement (OregonBuys)
 - > Payroll System Replacement
 - > Permanent Staffing for Workday
 - > Learning Management Module
 - > Enterprise Office 365
 - > IT Security Compliance
 - > Chief Business Technology Officers
 - > Challenge Grant funding for CASA and Special Olympics
 - > Office of the Public Records Advocate
