Governor's Budget - HB 5007

The Oregon Board of Chiropractic Examiners (OBCE) is an Other Funded agency responsible for the licensing and regulation of chiropractic physicians and certified chiropractic assistants. Our board consists of five chiropractic physicians and two public members, all of whom are appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Senate. We have 5.1 FTE staff (6 positions), including two Administrative Assistants (one at 1.0 FTE, one at .75 FTE), an Office Specialist (.75 FTE), an Investigator (1.0 FTE), a Health Care Investigator (.6 FTE), and Executive Director (1.0 FTE). Our assigned Assistant Attorney General is a critical part of our team.

- Currently, we have 42 open cases involving 34 licensees and 4 unlicensed persons.
- 1 licensee is suspended and 1 is on probation.

Budget Requests

We are requesting approval of two policy option packages:

- **POP 100 - Reclass Director to Approved HR Class**. \$36,680 Other Funds expenditure limitation increase to fund the DAS CHRO approved reclassification and compensation calculation for the Executive Director position, from PEM C to PEM D. Original request

to DAS' Central Evaluation Team was made in July 2017 and was approved as of August 1, 2017. This was the first time a class and compensation analysis was completed since 1990.

 POP 101 – Implement Database Upgrades. \$40,000 Other Funds expenditure limitation increase to fund replacement or improvement of Microsoft Access licensing database that has been in use since 1993. An updated, more user-friendly interface will increase staff efficiency in responding to public inquiries.

There was originally a third POP for an additional position, but we are not moving forward with that request at this time.

With approval of these POPs, we'll have an estimated ending cash balance for 2021 of \$281,995, approximately 3.0 months of operating expenditure in reserve.
