A one-size-fits-all approach is not appropriate. Each city is different, and each neighborhood within a given city is different. Local residents should have a voice in how their neighborhoods infill and create housing. Furthermore, this bill is unlikely to address the issue it claims to address (i.e., low/middle income housing). Easing zoning codes will primarily benefit developers, who will build luxury housing.

I urge you to halt this bill. At the very least, you should allow more opportunity for public testimony so that you can hear from the many who oppose this bill.
